Hire us



Originally from Sri Lanka, Anushiya has been based in Northern Ireland for over twenty years. Since completing her degree in Fine & Applied Arts at the Belfast School of Art, she has exhibited nationally and internationally as well as working as an arts facilitator for numerous public organisations including the Ulster Museum, schools, hospitals and galleries.

Anushiya trained as a printmaker but now works in both two and three dimensions, primarily using mixed media. Experimenting with materials, approaches and subject matter is at the core of her practice. Her work is influenced by the connected notion of a 'self' in transition and the challenges of identity as well as the nature of belonging, identity and place. She is interested in how natural and cultural environment shapes our sense of self and place. Her work is included in many prestigious collections including the

Arts Council of Northern Ireland, Queen's University, The Open University Ireland and Northern Bank.

WORKSHOPS WITH ANUSHIYA:

Tree of Life Drop-in Workshop for Children and Visitors

Saturday 22 June, 12noon-3pm. Free admission. Focusing on nature, kids aged 7+ years are invited to join the artist in creating a 'tree of life' in our gallery space. Looking at different types of trees and leaves, they will make a mixed media tree for our gallery space together, and experimenting with colour, texture and shape, decorate the tree with their own beautiful and unique colourful leaves.

Printmaking for Adults:

Learn monoprinting and drypoint etching with Anushiya in these two informal workshops, suitable for complete beginners.

> Drypoint printmaking, Saturday 29 June, 10am-4pm. Cost: £30

Dry point printmaking is one of the most direct of the intaglio printing techniques. Lines (images) are scratched directly into a plastic with a sharp tool, ink is applied and then print is taken. You can bring your drawings and images to the class to explore and experiment ideas to create a number of images.

> Monotype print, Saturday 6 July, 10am-4pm. Cost: £30

Monotype printing is known as the most painterly method of printing techniques. This workshop will allows you to experiment with different texture materials such as leaves, grass, flowers, threads, lace etc. You will also have an opportunity to cut stencils which will allow you to work with different layers colours to create unique print.



YOUNG PICASSO

We continue our Exhibition on Screen films which take both art lover and student behind the world's most renowned art museums and collections to explore celebrated artists and movements. Pablo Picasso is one of the greatest artists of all time – and right up until his death in 1973 he was the most prolific of artists. Many films have dealt with these later years –but where did this all begin? What made Picasso in the first place?

This stunning film explains how this young artist acquired his craft. Looking carefully at two key early periods – the so-called Blue Period and Rose Period – the film takes us all the way to 1907 and the creation of a critical painting in the history of art – Les Demoiselles d'Avignon. It was a painting that shocked the art world but changed it irrevocably. Picasso was only 25 years old. Working closely with all three Picasso Museums in Malaga, Barcelona and Paris this film explains how he rose to great heights.


